
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HAKUNA MATATA ACTIVITIES

ACTIVITIES	DESCRIPTION	OUTCOME
Education Support	Annually 12,000 rupees is saved in the individual bank account of the children for 5 years which amounts up to sup- port their further education. Daily tuition classes are provided to children in Dhanushadham through trained teachers to provide motivation for participation in formal education.	The beneficiaries will have a se- cure future to take admissions in their higher education at the end of 5 years. They will also receive regular tuition classes to strength- en their academic knowledge with relation to formal education.
Capacity Building Workshop	Annually one skill is focused on for the monthly capacity building session with the beneficiaries. The five focused upon skills are: public speaking, leadership, social skills, higher order thinking skills, positive self and career development.	The beneficiaries will receive workshops on public speaking, leadership, social skills, positive self and career building within 5 years.
Boot Camp	Annually a week long training will be conducted based on a specific skill to facilitate the monthly workshops such as leadership camp, basic computing, financial literacy and writing.	The beneficiaries will have the skill of formal writing, computer functions and public speaking at the end of 5 years.
Recreational Camp	Annually once a recreational camp will be conducted where the beneficiaries will be taken out of their place of origin and help them reconnect with the outer world. This will help strengthen the bond within the beneficiaries.	The beneficiaries will be exposed to the outer environment and build bonds with their peers.


ENGAGEMENT SO FAR

The program has been successful to provide the above activities to 50 beneficiaries since the year 2012. Currently it is working with 11 children in the valley who belong from settlement and low rent areas. The program also has initiated its work in Dhanushadham by providing regular education classes and capacity building workshops to 205 children from the Musahar community.
